IFF participated in the Idaho Youth Conference in October by providing information and staff. They are currently providing one on one support to parents and youth with COVID restrictions and precautions. Amy reports the Center has moved to their new location at 574 4th Street. The Center is open from noon until 8:00 pm. With grant monies, they have been able to increase the number of tutors and staff. They have two vans available now to pick up and take-home kids from Districts 91 and 93. They have implemented COVID-19 restrictions, and everyone must wear a mask. The center will be hosting a Friends Thanksgiving Dinner for the youth who are unable to be with their families.
