4. FINANCIAL REPORT | Randy Rodriquez

The FY21 year to date revenue is \$37,503.00 and total year-to-date expenditures are \$16,623.16. The YTD balance is \$20,879.84. With carryover dollars from previous years, the current fund balance is \$103,296.02. 5. BOARD BUSINESS | Samuel Hulse

A. Present Names for Open Board Seats

- B. Mental Health Award Nomination
Commissioner Reed nominated Mimi Taylor for the Mental Health Advocate Award for Region 7. Mimi serves on several boards and dedicates countless hours to supporting and serving others in the community.

Commissioner Reed made a motion to nominate Mimi Taylor for the Mental Health Award. Seconded by Stephanie Taylor-Silva. Motion passed.

6. FUNDING REQUESTS

- A. Suicide Postvention Project - Nancy Espeseth and Andra Smith Hansen presented the request. Andra agreed to provide quarterly reports to the Board.

Rick Whittaker made a motion to approve the grant request for \$18,000.00. Seconded by Stephanie Taylor-Silva. Motion passed.

- B. ICADD Scholarships - Darin Burrell presented the request. If more requests are received than funds available, recipients will be chosen via lottery style.

Chris Brayton made a motion to approve the grant request for up to \$3125.00 (10 one day scholarships @\$150.00 each and 5 full conference scholarships @\$325.00 each). Seconded by Ashley Stallings. Motion passed.

7. MEMORIAL DONATION FOR MARTHA TANNER | Samuel Hulse

Chairman Hulse presented the Martha Tanner Memorial Grant proposal. Teriann Ness-Parker, Chairman Hulse, and John Tanner developed the memorial grant. The Grant would award \$1,000 each fiscal year (July 1 to June 30) with the first award granted in Fiscal Year 2022 (starting 7/1/2021). The Grant will support mental health causes and crisis intervention in our region. There will be an application process developed and the requests will require R7BHB approval.

Dr. Tanner participated with the Mental Health Board. Along with her husband, John, she was a tireless advocate for individuals living with mental illness. She was also one of the founders of bringing Crisis Intervention to our area. She also helped with establishment the Crisis Center in Region 7.

Dr. Tanner passed away in February of this year.

Tim Thompson made a motion to approve to approve the Martha Tanner Funding Grant of \$1,000 each year, as long as funds are available. Seconded by Cheryl O'Connell. Motion passed.

- Crissy Bower announced that in conjunction with Mental Health Awareness Month in May, they are having a "Kites of Hope" Campaign. Optum will be partnering with Idaho Resilience Project to distribute kites through east Idaho. The message is to lift each other up.
- Rick Whittaker announced a new Pearl Health location at 582 S. Woodruff in Idaho Falls.

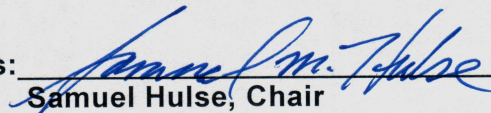

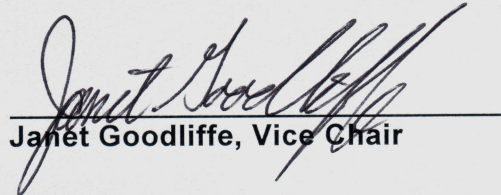
