Eastern Idaho Public Health serves Fremont County through their office building in St. Anthony, local schools, nursing homes, health fairs and more. We offer services such as WIC benefits, immunizations, food licensing, and septic inspections. The following are highlights of services provided in 2023.

Immunizations

Clinics provide vaccines for all ages including Influenza, COVID, Foreign Travel, and Routine. Limited reduced-cost vaccines are available for the under/uninsured.

WIC is a supplemental nutritional program for women, infants, and children who meet eligibility guidelines. WIC teaches healthy choices and breastfeeding support, offers risk screenings, and provides healthy foods like milk, fruits, vegetables and more.

Epidemiology

Doctors, labs, and other healthcare professionals are required to report certain diseases in Idaho. Staff track and determine disease impact and monitor trends to educate and provide prevention strategies.

Reproductive Health

This program treats, educates, and counsels individuals through annual exams, pregnancy tests, birth control, and STD visits. Most services are based on a sliding fee scale depending on household income.

Drug Overdose Prevention

40 Overdose Prevention Tools distributed into the community consisting of medical lockboxes and Detera deactivation pouches.

The Drug Overdose Prevention Program works to educate communities on the dangers of substance misuse. Staff partner with local law enforcement, healthcare providers, and community leaders to offer trainings and resources for organizations and individuals.

Youth Education & Prevention

75 Youth were taught tobacco prevention classes with an additional **5** facilitators who received training to teach.

The Tobacco Prevention, Control, and Cessation program works to reduce youth initiation, reduce exposure to secondhand smoke, and promote quitting. Staff build community partnerships, teach tobacco prevention education, and partner with communities to establish smoke free policies and spaces.
