Epidemiology

Doctors, labs, and other healthcare professionals are required to report certain diseases in Idaho. Staff track and determine disease impact and monitor trends to educate and provide prevention strategies.

Reproductive Health

This program treats, educates, and counsels individuals through annual exams, pregnancy tests, birth control, and STD visits. Most services are based on a sliding fee scale depending on household income.

Drug Overdose Prevention

Overdose Prevention Tools distributed into the community consisting of medical lockboxes and Deterra deactivation pouches.

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The Drug Overdose Prevention Program works to educate communities on the dangers of substance misuse. Staff partner with local law enforcement, healthcare providers, and community leaders to offer trainings and resources for organizations and individuals.

Early Childhood Development

Parents and children attended the early childhood development event BLOCK Fest. Parents and children learned math and science skills that will support school readiness through hands on block play.



Parents as Teachers is a home visiting program that promotes optimal early development, detection of developmental delays and health issues, and increase children's school readiness. This is done by engaging parents to develop their own skills by providing accurate information, educating, and modeling positive interactions with their children.
